We are delighted to have been awarded a National Lottery Grant of £544,900 from the Heritage Lottery Fund to deliver the Natural Prospects programme. Thanks to money raised by National Lottery players, this work based practical training will equip 24 trainees with the skills to gain an entry level role in the urban conservation sector including a City & Guilds Level 2 Work Based Certificate in Environmental Conservation.

Working in partnership with Birmingham, Walsall and Wolverhampton Councils, The Wildlife Trust for Birmingham and the Black Country are providing a series of one-year practical conservation training placements to highly motivated trainees with a keen interest in wildlife, conservation and connecting communities with nature.



To be eligible, you must be 18 or over and either;

- **a non-graduate, or**
- **in receipt of benefits/from an economically deprived area, or**
- **from a black or minority ethnic group**

Volunteering experience outdoors or with a community group will be beneficial
